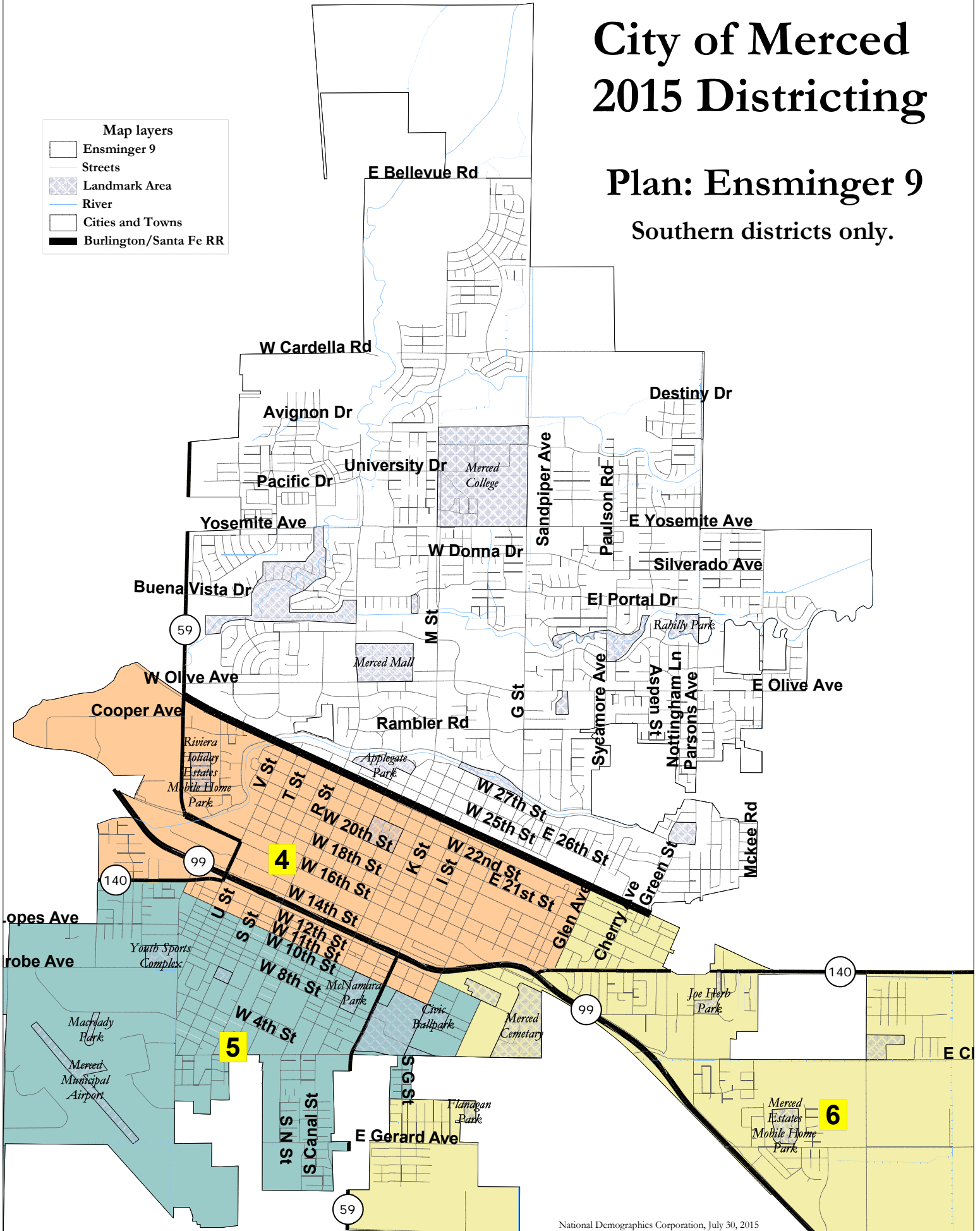


# City of Merced 2015 Districting

Mr. Ensminger's comments submitted with the Ensminger 9 map:

Here's another take using the RR, although I prefer Bear Creek. I like Ensminger 8 and 9 the best of all my proposals. I'm open to any configuration for north Merced the Committee decides. It's been a pleasure working with everyone.

This plan follows the RR tracks as specified in Settlement and Measure T. There are three distinct neighborhoods in south Merced: Downtown (4), South (5), and SouthEast (6). I support city council districts, but always thought the RR is an odd north/south boundry given the historical development of Merced. Our only choice during the election was to support Measure T or face a lawsuit, so I encourage the principals to renegotiate an agreement that uses Bear Creek as the historical north/south boundry of Merced.
